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Core Vocabulary vs. Fringe

Vocabulary can be categorized into two subsets: Core vocabulary and Fringe vocabulary. Core Vocabulary consists of the words most expressed by individuals and are versatile. These words are often sight words and verbs. Core vocabulary can be used and arranged to express many messages. Fringe vocabulary consists of words that occur infrequently and lack versatility.
